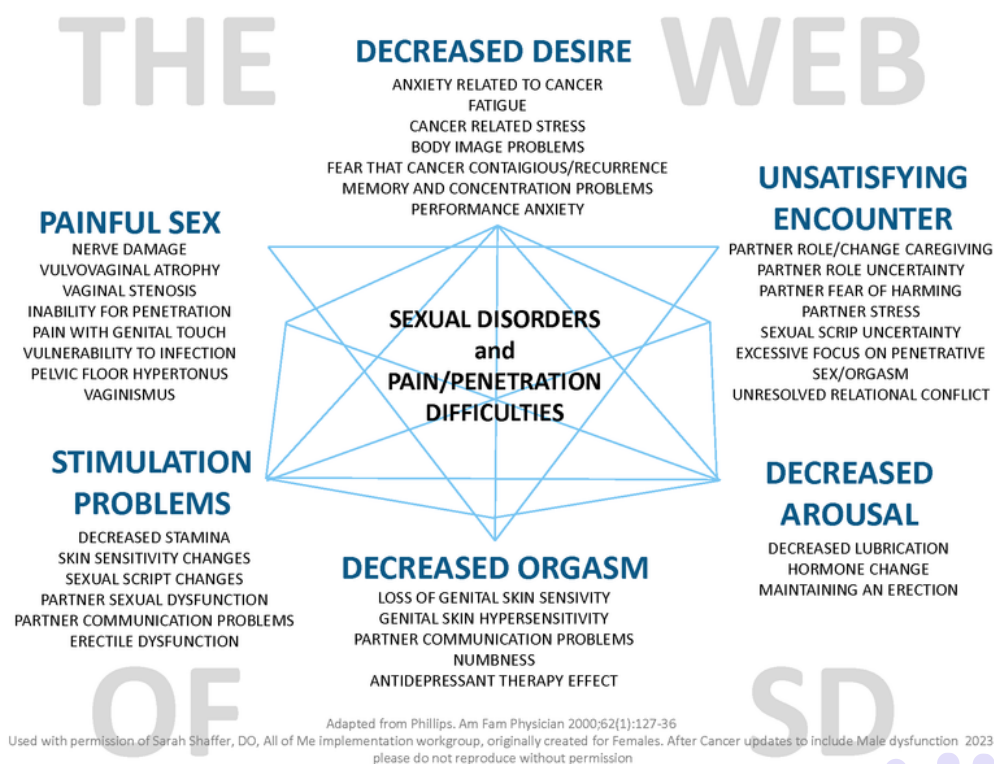


# Web of Sexual Dysfunction
