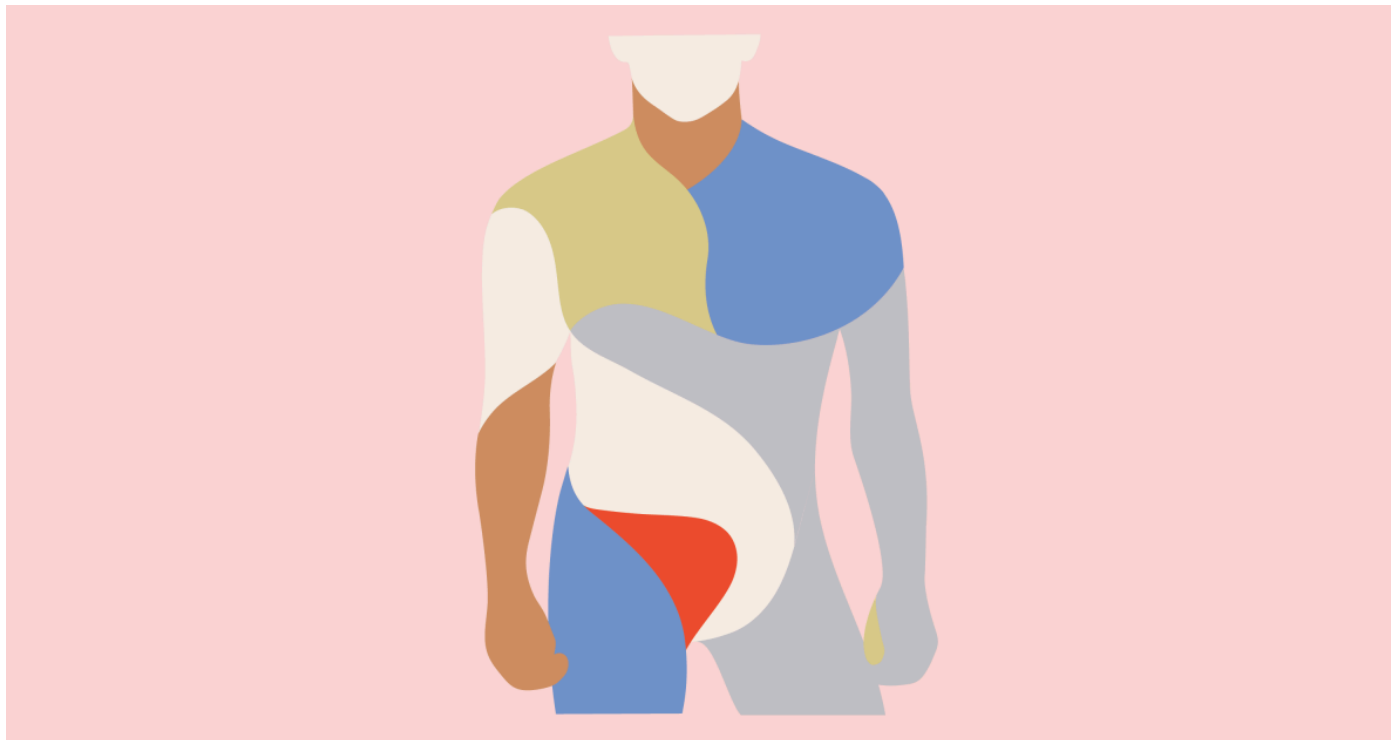


5 Ways Male Cancer Survivors Can Restore Sexual Function
